



## The Great UK Geographical Challenge      Year 5 / Year 6 Home Learning

We would like you to complete the home learning tasks from the list below. You only need  
To **complete one piece each week** and your **learning should be returned to school by Wednesday** of each week.

<p><b>Create a piece of artwork, based on a famous British monument.</b></p> <p>Identify a famous British landmark, statue or monument and create your own artwork. This could be a sketch, painting or collage.</p> <p>Possible starting points could include: Big Ben, Nelson's Column, Buckingham Palace, Tower Bridge etc.</p>	<p><b>Research the landmark, sculpture etc. that you have created your artwork on.</b></p> <p>Can you produce a fact file? Possible questions you could answer. When was it made? Why was it made? Who built/constructed it? How was it made? Why is it famous? How many people visit each year? Etc.</p>	<p><b>Construct a model of a famous British landmark or monument.</b></p> <p>You could use a range of materials and be creative. It could be a famous bridge, Stonehenge, a castle you have visited etc. These will be used as part of our display in class.</p>
<p><b>Create a persuasive poster to advertise and encourage people to visit a specific place in the UK.</b></p> <p>This could be a town, city, forest etc. Make sure you include appealing vocabulary and describe all the positive things that the place has to offer.</p>	<p><b>Write about a place that you have visited.</b></p> <p>Write a recount about a place that you have visited, this could be a village, town or city, perhaps somewhere you've been on holiday. Describe what it was like, what you did while you were there, how you felt etc. Write in the first person and the past tense.</p>	<p><b>Complete the coordinates maths activity.</b></p> <p>Answer the questions on the coordinates activity worksheet. Remember the x axis (across) coordinate comes first, followed by the Y axis coordinate (up and down)</p>
